Promoter of a race last year does not want to continue so we have tentively agreed a joint promotion for this year at Blackwell Court potentially on 2nd November. Would like volunteers from the club to help out for the Saturday/Sunday to help organise and marshal. This will hopefully become a Stourbridge Club race from now on. Location is a big issue, so if anyone knows of a venue then please advise Steve. Stourbridge field the most adult riders in the league but haven't got a race to put on.

Touring Ride

- I think it's fair to say that the Touring rides have been a continued success this year and this is due to the the guys and gals that come out riding.
- Of the 52 rides scheduled to have taken place since the last report, 6 were cancelled because of poor weather and others were severley hampered
- This is by far the most since I took over as Touring Secretary 5 years ago.
- I've felt that the weather has waited until Sunday before raining
- There were an average of 13 riders on each ride, which is down 3 on last year. I think this is down to the poor weather and some of the tourers that have started racing cyclo cross.
- The maximum number of riders on a ride was 26; on the Holly Run, and we had 24 out on the April Fool's Day ride to Spiders
- We have visited 26 different venues this year. With Brewood and Spiders being our favourite destination
- There were 13 different ride leaders, up 3 on last year including members leading their first rides
- Whilst it's unfair to single any ride leader out special thanks should go to Richard Nicol and Paul Green who took on and led 9 rides each.
- Once again I'd like to place on record my thanks to ALL the Ride leaders who so willingly give up their time to lead rides. It makes this job so much easier, and all the riders that come along who make riding on a Sunday such an enjoyable experience.
- There is a note of caution the club needs to decide how we manage and run the Touring ride. With riders getting faster and wishing to push themselves more we, need to a their requirements against how we ensure, as a club, that the ride remains a gateway for new members to get a foothold into road riding with the club.

Coaching

The club funded two additional level 2 coaching courses this year to bring out total number of coaches up to seven. Pam Saunders and Tracey Hipkiss have joined Kevin Payton, Tom Payton, Quinn Byetheway, Matt Bowker and Anthony Neeve. Mountain Bike, Track and Cyclocross coaching was offered last year and will be offered again this year.

This coaching is aimed at all riders and will improve skills whatever the current ability. There will be a focus on improving technique that will enable riders to ride more safely and therefore reducing risks of accidents. There will be some basic around how to ride safely in a group and how to deal with common traffic situations. There will also be opportunities to work on more advanced and racing skills for those that want this. Anthony N leading the session with Kevin and Tom (and possibly others supporting).

Mountain Bike:
